

'Let's Stop HIV Together' Awareness Campaign in Spanish

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) expanded its HIV awareness campaign, "Let's Stop HIV Together," by launching a Spanish-language version, "Detengamos Juntos el VIH," according to a CDC statement. The campaign now includes new participants, offers more materials in both Spanish and English, and has a new website in Spanish to raise awareness and reduce stigma. The Spanish-language materials consist of public service announcements for radio and TV, three personal video stories, 12 campaign posters, and a brochure and palm card.
