Wednesday, April 10, marks National Youth HIV & AIDS Awareness Day ([NYHAAD](#)) 2019. Launched by Advocates for Youth in 2013, the event highlights the need for testing, prevention and treatment among youth and promotes awareness of their HIV-related needs.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ([CDC](#)), data from the Youth Risk Behavior Survey from 2007 to 2017 show that the proportion of high school students who ever had sex was 48 percent in 2007 compared with 40 percent in 2017. The report notes that “although overall students are making better decisions about their health, there are still too many students reporting risky sexual behaviors, high-risk substance use, violence victimization and poor mental health.” In fact, the CDC also states:

- 1 in 5 new HIV diagnoses were among people ages 13 to 24

- Only 9 percent of high school students have ever been tested for HIV.
