Across the globe, about 300 million people are living with viral hepatitis and don’t know it. (For perspective, the population of the entire United States is 327 million.) World Hepatitis Day ([WHD](#)) is marked each July 28. Viral hepatitis—specifically hepatitis C virus (HCV) and hepatitis B virus (HBV)—is one of the leading causes of death worldwide, according to the World Hepatitis Alliance, which spearheads WHD. Viral hepatitis is responsible for 1.34 million deaths a year and causes two out of every three liver cancer deaths.

The good news is that there's a cure for hep C and a vaccine and treatment for hep B. That's why it's important for people to get tested for hepatitis. After all, they can't access treatment and a cure if they don't know they have the virus. What's more, people who are aware of their status can take steps to ensure they don't transmit it.
